<p>Guest Speaker / presentation</p>	<p>Mark Green, Executive Director, Downeast Community Partners (merged former agencies WHCA and Child & Family Opportunities) speaking on Housing — Heating & Weatherization; Transportation; Financial services; Aging in Place supports; Veterans supports</p> <p>Energy Services (Lee Hardison) LiHeap; Electric assistance program; Emergency Heating Crisis (\$400/yr life threatening situations); Safelink - free cell phone & minutes; FEMA assistance to assist local food pantries/shelters; THAW - additional home energy assistance; Family Crisis Management services; Keep Me Warm & AMP programs supplement LiHeap eligible clients; CBDG programs - community specific grants & loans for home repair; Housing Home repair</p> <p>Housing (Jennifer Trowbridge) Weatherization, Energy Audit, Central Heating improvement (furnace repair/replace); Storage Tank/buried piping replacement; Efficiency Maine (special projects)</p> <p>Supportive Services (Ida Davis) Resource Services for income eligible households include a Family Advocate to work towards various goals, including the Home Energy Efficiency goal, which has the potential for \$300 credit on electric bill; Assurance 16 (new program to reduce energy costs); Family Development Accounts</p> <p>Transportation services (Cheryl Robbins) — primarily MaineCare rides to medical appts though contracts may be entered for other transportation services. New program “Rides for a Cure” provides transportation for Cancer patients (no income reqts) to/from medical appts.; Community Transportation for Seniors (supported by the FTA with local match from EAAA & DCP)</p> <p>Early Child Care & Education (Melissa Mattes) — Head Start & Public Pre-K at Mountain View School</p> <p>Friendship Cottage (Anne Ossanna) senior day program using medical model, transportation available, \$14/hr, often paid by insurance.</p> <p>At Home Downeast & At Home MDI (Kara Janes) membership / volunteer services - provides essential services to remain at Home</p> <p>Special Projects (Bobbi Harris) - Accountable Care Act Navigator; Backpacks & Christmas; Foreclosure Counseling; Hancock Child Abuse & Neglect;</p> <p>Financial Services (Kevin Bean) Business loans \$1K-\$50K; tax preparation services</p>	<p>Mark will have Lee Harrison contact Candy to discuss LiHeap outreach & appointments in Sullivan.</p>
